Annual Report 2024–2025

Background of the Organization –

In India, during the 1990s, Dr. Martha Alter Chen's study "*Perpetual Mourning*" highlighted the social condition of widows in the country. It revealed that lakhs of widows were living their lives trapped in multiple deprivations—without any social security pension, without social dignity, and without rights over property. The study showed how patriarchal thinking had pushed these women to the margins of society.

In such a situation, Dr. Ginny Shrivastava of the Astha Sansthan resolved to change this reality. With faith in the collective strength of people and women, a four-day state-level convention of 450 widows from 21 districts was organized from 16–19 November 1999 in the Bassi block of Jaipur. This convention laid the foundation of the Ekal Nari Shakti Sangathan – a collective of single women.

Although this movement initially began with widowed women, the women said they wanted other women whose life situation was similar to theirs in their new organization. Other single women—such as divorced women, abandoned women, unmarried adult women, women whose husbands are missing, women whose husbands are undergoing life imprisonment, and women whose husbands are suffering from serious illnesses and they then had to be the head of their households—gradually became part of this movement too.

With this initiative, the leadership of single women formally constituted the registered society "Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan" "The Organization of Strong Women Alone" in April 2002, which today is being run entirely under the leadership of low-income single women. At present, the organization is working across 29 districts, 92 blocks, and 470 panchayats of Rajasthan, connecting with more than 1,00,000 single women. Through mutual support and collective solidarity, the organization works towards addressing their issues and advancing their lives.

Prevailing Social Perceptions Related to Single Women

*The world belongs to men, and what life can a woman have without a man?
Then what identity does such a woman have?*

In society, a woman's existence has always been viewed in relation to a man. If a woman does not have a husband, society's perception of her image and worth changes immediately. Patriarchal thinking is deeply entrenched in our social fabric, leading to the belief that single women are weak, helpless, powerless, deserving of pity, and vulnerable to exploitation.

Male-dominated society has, for centuries, bound such single women in the shackles of social evils and regressive traditions, so that they may not break these chains and raise their voices for their rights and for a life of dignity.

However, in 1999, the collective organization of single women proved through their strength, courage, and struggle that "single women may be alone, but they are not weak." If given an opportunity, they have the power to change the world. And today, the organization is providing them that opportunity—bringing their strength to the forefront.

Our Vision, Mission and Objectives

Vision

A society where single women of all religions, castes, communities, classes, and age groups are able to live their lives as empowered citizens. A society where they can fully enjoy their legal, social, and cultural rights—with self-confidence, dignity, and freedom—and where every single woman takes pride in herself and shines with her own identity.

Mission

To enable single women from all castes, religions, age groups, classes, and communities to improve their lives through mutual cooperation and collective unity, to emerge as empowered citizens, and, together with other marginalized groups, to contribute towards building an egalitarian and just society

Objectives

To empower and strengthen single women from economically weaker sections of society in such a way that they are able to collectively bring positive change in their social, mental, economic, traditional, and cultural conditions. Through this process, they can live lives of dignity as empowered citizens and, through their courage and determination, bring transformation within themselves as well as in society.

Activities and Programmes Conducted During the Year

Regular Monthly Meetings in Gram Panchayats

Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan organized monthly meetings of single women in 470 Gram Panchayats across 92 Blocks of 29 Districts within its operational area. A total of 83,447 participants, including single women, other women, men, public representatives, and representatives of government departments, took part in these meetings.

During these meetings, key issues related to single women were discussed on a monthly basis, such as:

- Whether benefits under social security schemes are being received or not
- Food security
- MGNREGA (NREGA)
- Violence against women
- Participation in Gram Sabhas
- Corruption
- Leadership of single women
- Violence against children
- Other local collective issues

Through collective discussion and joint efforts, work was undertaken towards problem identification and resolution.

State-Level Single Women Leadership Meetings

State-level Single Women Leadership Meetings are organized three times a year. This is a very important committee, which provides direction and guidance to the work related to single women. In these meetings which are organized every four months, following agenda points are discussed:

- District-wise reporting
- Planning of upcoming activities
- Other important decisions

During this year, three meetings were organized in Jaipur and Udaipur, in which 172 participants took part.



Case Studies

Only Awareness Can Stop Harassment - Maan Kanwar

Raising Voice Against Harassment-----

Maan Kanwar is a resident of Dilli Pura village, Sangod tehsil, Kota district, and has been a member of the organization for many years. She never went to school, yet people who are educated often fall short in front of her confidence. She has helped hundreds of women in securing their rights. A recent incident occurred when she was traveling from Kota to Mandana to visit her relatives. On the same bus, an elderly woman was traveling with her granddaughter. The granddaughter, a girl of about 13–14 years, was continuously crying.

Maan Kanwar asked the grandmother why the girl was crying. The grandmother replied that she was crying like that only. Then Maan Kanwar gently asked the girl not to be afraid and to tell her what had happened. The girl told her that a fat, dark-complexioned man sitting in front of her had been staring at her for a long time and was making obscene gestures. The grandmother, out of fear, was unable to say anything. When Maan Kanwar looked at the man, he appeared aggressive and intimidating. Showing presence of mind, Maan Kanwar quietly called the next police station and narrated the entire incident. At the next stop, the Mandana police stopped the bus, questioned Maan Kanwar and the girl in detail, and thrashed the man before taking him to the police station. The bus was then allowed to proceed.

The passengers on the bus began discussing among themselves, saying, *“She is a very intelligent woman. She doesn’t look educated, but she did something remarkable.”*

No One Should Take Advantage of Your Loneliness.....



NO means NO only, There is no hidden ‘yes’ in that...

Janki Bai (name changed) is a resident of Village Madar, Gram Panchayat Sakarwas, Tehsil Railmagra, District Rajsamand. Her husband passed away four years ago. Unknown to her, her husband had taken a loan of ₹2,00,000 (two lakh rupees) from a bank. Someone from the Panchayat informed her about this loan. Janki Bai informed the organization’s field worker that Panchayat officials were repeatedly calling her and pressuring her to deposit the loan amount. She told them that she is a very poor single woman, has no money, and cannot repay such a large amount. The same person who was calling her then told her that if she could not repay the loan, she should go with him on a trip to Kankroli, and he would waive off the entire amount. Janki Bai refused and immediately

informed the organization's worker about the incident. The worker advised her that whenever she receives such calls again, she should tell them that the entire conversation is being recorded on her phone, and that she will submit it to the police station. Janki Bai followed this advice. After this, the man got scared and said, "No, no, you don't need to deposit the two lakh rupees. I will waive off your loan. But don't tell anyone about this." It was clear that he was trying to threaten and exploit Janki Bai because she was a single woman.

With a little awareness and understanding, Janki Bai was able to come out of this problem. When other women heard about this incident, they said that nowadays everyone tries to take advantage of single women, but with the guidance of the organization's worker, the problem was resolved. Therefore, being connected with the organization is essential.

Action Against Corruption in MGNREGA by Single Women Leaders

"Go and File a Complaint Against Me, Then You'll Get Work Under MGNREGA"

- On the complaint of single women leaders, the Dholpur Collector ordered an inquiry.
- Due to serious irregularities and fraud found in 15 Panchayats, 74 Mates were blacklisted.

As a result of the efforts and complaints made by single women leaders, 74 Mates from different Gram Panchayats were blacklisted. During the inquiry, officials from various levels of MGNREGA were found guilty. Under this action, District Collector Shri Nidhi B. T. issued show-cause notices to 17 officials, which included officials from the Water Resources Department, Junior Engineers, MGNREGA Mates, Junior Assistants, Gram Panchayat Village Development Officers, Junior Technical Officers, Assistant Engineers (MGNREGA), and Development Officers.

Premvati Bai is a 49-year-old single widow woman, resident of Naksauda Gram Panchayat, Bari tehsil, Dholpur district. She has been associated with the organization for the last 11 years. Premvati has six children, owns a small piece of agricultural land, and along with this, she also works under the employment guarantee scheme (MGNREGA).

In Premvati's village, MGNREGA work was going on in the month of April. During this time, single women were not being given work, and even in meetings, complaints were continuously being raised that three Mates were writing fake attendance lists. Premvati, who is a single women leader, listened to the women's problems and went to the Mate and asked why single women were not being provided work. On hearing this, the Mate replied, "I will not give you work because you think you are a big leader. You had earlier also complained against me to the Development Officer. You try to file a complaint against me, then you will see whether you

get work under MGNREGA.” Premvati and the single women collectively decided that they would not remain silent and would fight for their rights. Premvati then went to meet the Development Officer along with 15 women.

On 8 May 2024, 15 single women of Naksauda Gram Panchayat went to the Development Officer at Bari tehsil. There, they were told that they would not be given work in MGNREGA at present and that work would be allotted only when their turn came. Premvati said that in her village fake attendance was being recorded in MGNREGA, they were in need of work, and the Mate was acting arbitrarily. The Development Officer ignored their complaint. Hearing all this, Premvati became very distressed, and along with all the single women, on the same day, she went to the SDM



and the District Collector. They listened to their issues carefully, took the complaint in writing, and immediately initiated action.

Based on the complaints of the organization’s women, the SDM and the Collector ordered an inquiry. On 30 May, the entire administration became strict regarding irregularities in MGNREGA work, and action was initiated. Through media reports, women came to know that, as per the directions of the District Collector, a team inspected MGNREGA works in 15 Gram Panchayats of Bari Panchayat Samiti. During the inspection, large-scale fraud, serious irregularities, and negligence were found. As a result, 74 Mates from various Gram Panchayats were blacklisted. In the inquiry, officials from different levels of MGNREGA were found guilty. Under this, District Collector Shri Nidhi B. T. issued show-cause notices to 17 officials, including officials from the Water Resources Department, Junior Engineers, MGNREGA Mates, Junior Assistants, Gram Panchayat Village Development Officers, Junior Technical Officers, Assistant Engineers (MGNREGA), and Development Officers.

Strength of the Organization:- In Nakhsonda Gram Panchayat, people acknowledged the strength of the organization because, at that time, MGNREGA work was completely stopped, which exposed those who were benefiting from fake attendance. In August, MGNREGA work was restarted after two months, for plantation activities, in which single women were provided work. Now, the new Mate is not recording fake attendance at all. After the inquiry and action taken on the organization’s complaint, the Mates in nearby areas also became cautious, and the organization’s women are now getting work. The women said, “Everything is possible through the organization. The organization is our life, and together we are a storm.”

Capacity Building Training

Capacity Building Training of Single Women Leaders



“Learning is a lifelong process, companions; one who does not learn, does not move forward.”

During the year 2024–25, the organization conducted issue-based capacity building trainings for single women block-level leaders, panchayat-level leaders, and executive committee members. These trainings were organized with the objective of strengthening organizational work at the panchayat level, enhancing the capacities of single women, and creating awareness on child protection from sexual abuse. A total of 7 training programmes were conducted, in which 306 single women leaders participated at different levels.



Special Activities

Bahna Dooj “Sisterhood Festival” A week-long celebration of dignity and respect



On the occasion of Bahna Dooj – the Sisterhood Festival , the Department of Social Justice and Empowerment, through its officials, honoured single women, acknowledging their dignity and rights

We all know that due to deeply rooted patriarchal thinking in society, a common statement is often heard on various platforms and in everyday life: “Women themselves are women’s enemies—what can be done?” In our society, most rituals and fasts observed for a prosperous life and long life are performed for sons, husbands, brothers, etc. However, there is no ritual or fast created by women for women, whether she is a daughter, daughter-in-law, mother-in-law, or mother—no such tradition exists that wishes for the long life and well-being of women themselves. Nor has there been any conscious effort to strengthen women-to-women relationships by creating a festival dedicated to this bond.





On the occasion of Behnadoo "festival of sisterhood" awareness rallies were organized

Therefore, single women collectively initiated this festival in 2016. For the first three years, it was celebrated at the state level, and now single women celebrate it enthusiastically at the panchayat, block, and district levels according to their own capacity. The dress code for this programme is red chunri or red

saree/suit, because for single widowed women, this colour is traditionally prohibited in society. Thus, this festival not only breaks social taboos, but also strengthens love, harmony, and sister-to-sister bonds. Women from all religions, castes, and communities participate in it. This festival—and the 26-year journey of single women—is a strong response to those who claim that “women are women’s enemies.”

Festival of Sisterhood - a festival of love, harmony, and our dignity

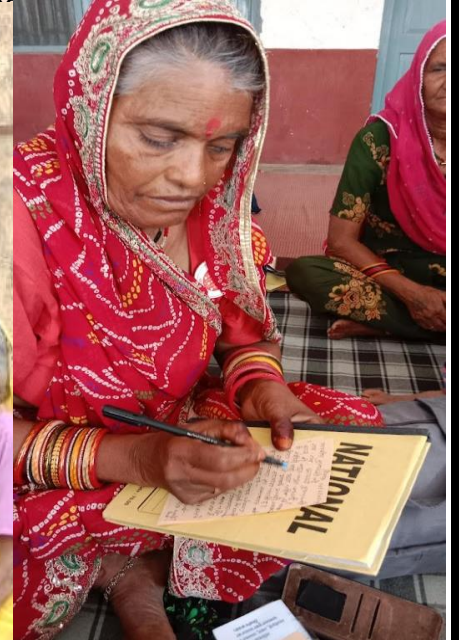
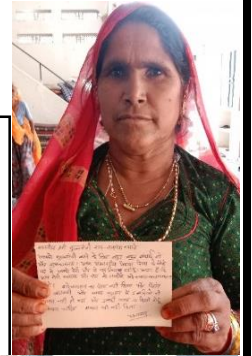
As in previous years, during 2024, Bahindooj the Festival of Sisterhood was celebrated with great enthusiasm from 5–10 November 2024 across 92 blocks of 29 districts within the operational area of Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan in Rajasthan. During this week-long programme, single women organised rallies at district, block, and panchayat levels, seminars on women’s issues, cultural programmes, tying of raksha-sutra, and oath-taking ceremonies, among other activities. A total of 3,995 single women, public representatives, and other supporters participated in these events.

For organising these programmes, ₹93,380.00 was received “in kind” as public contributions, and ₹98,875.00 was received as cash donations. In several districts and blocks, special programmes were organised at the block and district levels, in which officials from various departments and public representatives participated as chief guests.

23 June International Widows' Day (Observed as Single Women Empowerment Day)

Widowed and single women have an equal role in the development of society and family, and when a woman becomes single, the responsibility of society increases even more to ensure that she receives full respect along with emotional support, and is not deprived of her rights.

These are the women who dedicate their entire lives to their families, and who form the foundation of our households and families and communities. We must respect them.



Single women in Rajasthan observed International Widows' Day (23 June 2024) as Single Women Empowerment Day from 15–23 June 2024. During this period, meetings at the panchayat level, discussions on women's issues, problem-solving sessions, and seminars were organised primarily by single women. Along with this, on this day, single women sent more than 20,000 postcards from 92 blocks addressed to the Honourable Prime Minister and Chief Minister, highlighting issues related to increase in ration entitlements, pensions, housing, employment, and other concerns.

Impact: As a result of this initiative, government departments responded to the postcards sent by women under their own names and addresses, and the problems of hundreds of single women were resolved. This helped the government better understand the issues of single women.

Awareness Programme on Sexual Violence and Harassment Against Children

Do not hide anything from parents; come home and share everything

- More than 1,220 children participated in the child sexual abuse awareness programme
- Children learned about Good Touch and Bad Touch
- Parents and teachers were made aware about child sexual abuse

From 14 November 2024, the organization, through single women leaders, organised awareness programmes on prevention and safety against sexual violence and harassment of young children in 25 panchayats across 25 blocks of 8 districts. These programmes were conducted in settlements and schools, focusing on protection and prevention of child sexual abuse. A total of 1,220 boys and girls aged 5 to 16 years, along with parents and 39 teachers, participated. Children presented songs, poems, and speeches on gender equality, and through posters and role-plays, they were taught about Good Touch and Bad Touch. Parents and teachers stated that this was the first time such information was being provided in their school, and that such awareness is extremely necessary. Initially, children felt hesitant during discussions on Good Touch and Bad Touch, and girls felt shy, but gradually they became comfortable and listened attentively. During the meetings, parents said, "You are doing very good work. We feel shy talking about such matters with our children. Please keep coming, so that our children remain safe and informed."

Women Farmers Awareness Programme

The Women Farmers Awareness Programme has been implemented by Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan for the past three years. Under this programme, in 18 gram panchayats across 9 blocks, women farmers are being introduced to organic farming, preparation of indigenous fertilizers, kitchen gardens, and new agricultural practices. A total of 350 women farmers are associated with this programme, who have made several changes in their farming practices, leading to increased indigenous production and income. Among them, 70% are single women farmers and 30% are married women farmers.

Operation of Women Protection and Counselling Centre

In 2011, the Government of Rajasthan entrusted the responsibility of operating the Women Protection and Counselling Centre, Kota city to Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan. The organization has been successfully operating the Centre for the last 15 years. During the year 2024–25, a total of 395 cases were received at the Centre, out of which 288 cases were resolved. In all the 395 cases, efforts were made to resolve issues by providing appropriate counselling, advice, and guidance. Some key details are as follows: -

Apart from these, women victims were supported through counseling, guidance, and advice for various other types of problems.



Breaking Patriarchal Norms – Single Women

Single Women – An Example of Social Change

A common societal mindset is that women are meant only to manage household chores—that there is no need for higher education or stepping outside the home. There is a saying, “*Paka handi gaar kaani laage*” (meaning: every task is meant to be learnt in a particular age—what can one learn in middle age?), while others say that certain work / jobs are meant only for men.

However, women have proven themselves in every field, challenging and changing societal norms. They have done tasks that were traditionally considered the exclusive domain of men and demonstrated that women are equally capable.

Similarly, when single women break age-old patriarchal norms and move forward, observers often say in amazement “Wow! She’s become like a man!” Some experiences are shared below:

- **Nakki Bai, Jhadol, Udaipur District:** It is often said that women cannot plough fields, but after her husband’s death, Nakki Bai broke this tradition and began ploughing her own fields herself, as tractors could not be used there. Farming was the only livelihood, and she also had to take care of her children. For the past 15 years, Nakki Bai has been ploughing her fields herself. Initially, people mocked her, but now they say - “She is not a woman, she is a man.” She is the only woman in her village who ploughs fields herself.



- **Lahro Devi, Baytu, Barmer District:** Lahro Devi, a 54-year-old abandoned single woman, has three daughters. After her husband remarried, she joined the Brahma Kumaris and later worked with other social organizations as a social worker for women. She says passion is a powerful force. Lahro Devi had a strong desire to drive vehicles (*four-wheelers*) from the beginning. About 15–16 years ago, she hired a driver for 15 days to learn driving. Today, Lahro Devi drives all kinds of vehicles, and people say in admiration - “Wow! That’s amazing.”



- **Rupa Devi, Lohawat, Phalodi District:** After her husband's death at the age of 29, Rupa Devi took up farming herself. During agricultural work, she needed to operate a tractor, so she learned to drive a tractor on her own. Villagers watch her in astonishment and say - That's incredible!

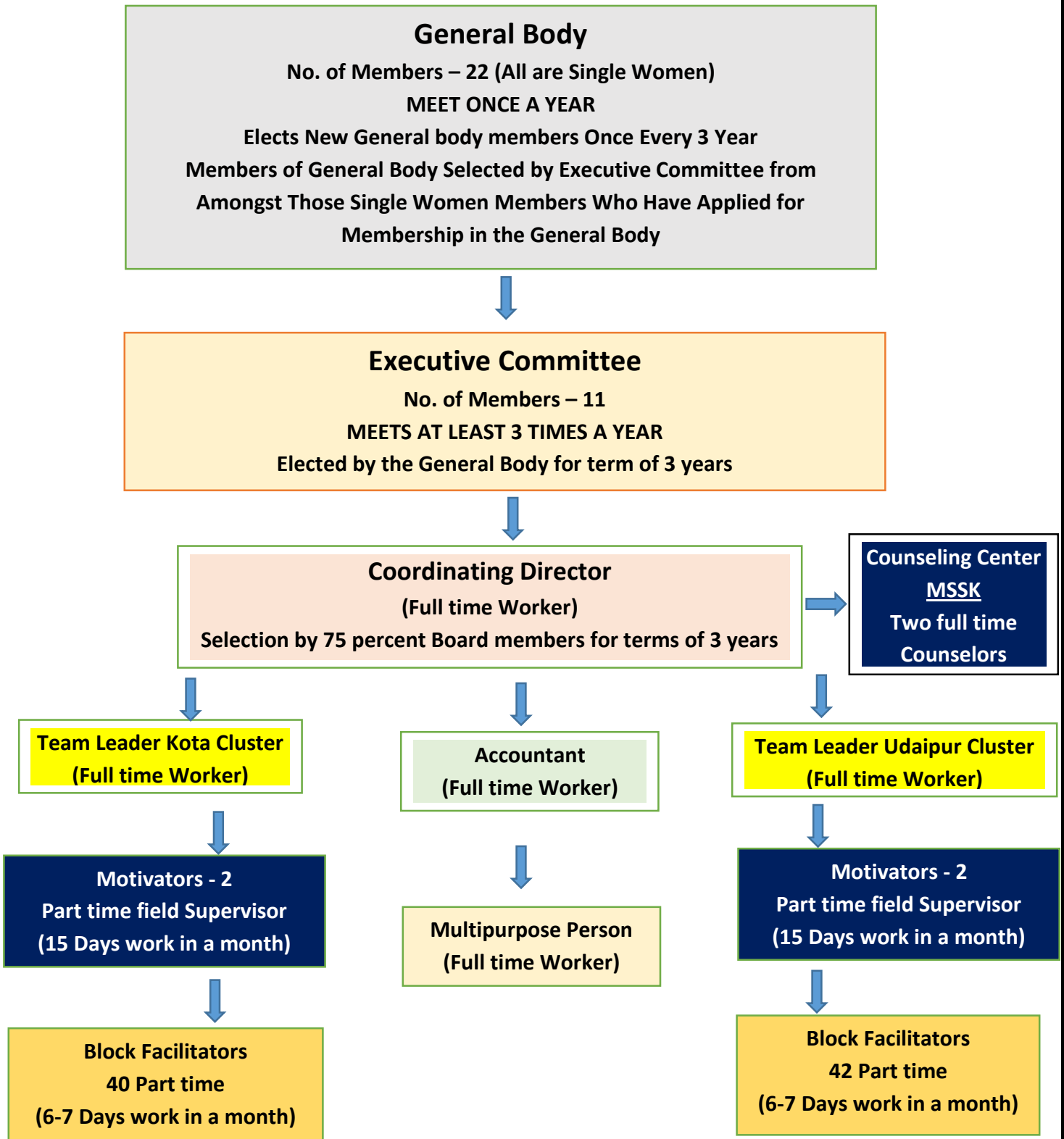


- **Pavni Devi, Pindwara Block, Sirohi District:** Pavni Devi, around 35 years old, faced severe financial crisis at home. She took up several small jobs, but household expenses were still difficult to manage. Using her savings, she bought an old auto-rickshaw and started operating it in the village. Male auto drivers opposed her and harassed her, as their earnings were affected. Pavni did not give up; she filed a complaint with the traffic police, who warned the male drivers not to trouble her or face legal action. Seeing Pavni, many girls in the village have now become auto drivers. Pavni says, The organization always gives me strength. I never feel alone.

Institutional Governance and Implementation

The work of Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan is primarily managed and implemented by single women themselves. Experienced single women leaders play a central role at every level - whether as Board Members or as Panchayat-level single women leaders - ensuring meaningful participation of single women in decision-making processes. At the Panchayat level, work is initiated under the leadership of experienced single women leaders. Senior and experienced leaders train and mentor new leadership, creating a continuous pipeline of emerging leaders for the future.

In Rajasthan, the organization's work is primarily divided into three clusters - Kota, Udaipur, and Jodhpur. Each cluster has a full-time support team member actively engaged in implementation and coordination.

Administrative Implementation

- **Full-Time Administrative Team** - For coordination of organizational activities, a full-time administrative team consisting of 8 members is actively functioning. This team is led by the Coordinating Director. The team provides continuous support and guidance to regional Single Women leadership.
- **Block Facilitators** - The organization has 82 Single Women Block Facilitators, who are working across the organization's operational area of 92 Blocks, closely engaging with Single Women to address and resolve their issues. Each Block Facilitator organizes monthly meetings of Single Women in 5 Panchayats within their respective Block, facilitating collective discussion and problem-solving.
Every month block facilitators cluster-wise monthly meetings organized by sansthan .These meetings focus on planning upcoming activities, presentation of monthly work reports, discussion on challenges and problem-solving, and sharing of experiences.

Note: The achievements listed above are reflected numerically; however, beyond these figures, significant capacity building has occurred through courage-building, leadership development, training programs, and exposure visits. These efforts have brought transformational change in the lives of single women. The organization's continuous effort is to mainstream single women and nurture leadership among them. Through this sustained process, hundreds of women leaders are prepared every year, many of whom now work not only with Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan but also with other institutions and collectives, contributing to broader processes of social change.

District-Level Recognition by Administration
